LfN: Reflection of our users' needs

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With contribution from LfN committee colleagues

Back in 2002 the Health Libraries Group (HLG) special interest group of CILIP undertook a membership survey. This included a section (section 7) on the two sub groups of HLG) – Information for the Management of Healthcare (IfMH), and Libraries for Nursing (LfN).

While the response rate was not high (404 out of 2,100), the LfN committee thought it would be useful if we looked at these results and let you know what we have tried to do in response to the comments, before possibly undertaking any further survey. Despite the small response the survey did give some us useful data and comments with which to move forward.

The survey was split into sections and asked a variety of questions, relating to the Bulletin, website and study days. Some required grading on a sliding scale where 1 was poor and 5 was excellent, and some asked for free text comments.

Bulletin...

Most responses rated the Bulletin as good and it was seen as useful by those who work with nurses.

- Free text comments covered a variety of aspects from the text size and layout, to the content. We have recently increased the font size so hopefully readers will find this helpful.
- We now publish the bulletin regularly four times a year – (April, June, September and December).
- Another comment suggested the inclusion of information relevant to allied health professions. Following the closure of INFAH (Information for Allied Health) in 2003, which was also a sub-group of HLG, we were given a donation of money which we have been using as part of our widening remit to include allied health. Later this year we aim to have an issue of the Bulletin specifically relating to allied health information issues and resources.
- We are also going to introduce a current literature column of topical, current and relevant information (articles, books, websites, reports, documents etc.).

Responses about the LfN website concentrated on the content, but mainly from a relevancy angle, and on the currency of the material. Study days...

Most respondents rated study days as good or excellent which is encouraging.

- We try to make our study days relevant to the fields of nursing, midwifery, health visiting and increasingly allied health and also to take up the suggestions we have from the evaluation forms filled out by attendees.
- We have also noted the suggestions from the HLG survey and have tried to cover some of these. For example, we have run study days covering issues relating to access to information and libraries for nurses and also resources for nurses, which were two topics suggested in the survey.
- We always try to cover topics relevant and useful to both our members and interested non-members, but it is not always possible to cover all suggestions, especially immediately in the following year.
- We usually run two main study days in spring and autumn and occasionally a joint event with HLG. In Northern Ireland our representative, Maureen Dwyer works with colleagues across sectors to deliver training events useful to people locally.
- We are also aiming to spread our events out geographically, in response to feedback from members. Our recent May study day was held at the RCN in Cardiff and we are thinking about holding a study day in Scotland during 2006.
